

Photography Survey for Teens

This 8 week-long class which meets for 2 hours once a week will introduce students to the fascinating subject of photography. We will briefly cover the historical development of the camera, analyze some famous images from the past and present, learn basic composition and design, and discover various camera similarities. Students will have the opportunity to shoot with film and develop prints in the darkroom. Students will also have the opportunity to take photographs with a pro-grade digital camera, see a demonstration of Photoshop CS3, and print out a professional quality ink-jet print. Each class will have hands-on time with digital and/or photo-lab equipment. Great introduction for a high school or college-level photo class, but without the reading, homework, and tests! This class is based on materials used in a high-school-level photo class. Students do not need a 35mm film camera.

Our **Stage One Classes** are an introduction to dance through a ballet-based creative movement for boys and girls. Using music, movement and make-believe, students develop their dance skills. Young dancers experiment with new ways to move their bodies, both directed and free-form, with attention to musicality and rhythm. Age-appropriate cognitive skills, such as counting, sequential organization, spatial awareness and comparative abstract concepts are woven into the class structure.

In our **Stage Two Classes**, we focus on understanding correct posture and alignment, which allows for greater balance and controlled movement. More complex rhythms are introduced to develop musicality and coordination. The ballet vocabulary grows as we stress using correct terminology. In Stage Two, dancers expand their movement vocabulary by adding a 30 minute jazz class. Choreography learned in the jazz class will be presented each session.

AUDREY FENSKE has been a member of the Triangle Youth Ballet family since 1995. She continued her studies at the Virginia School of the Arts, and received the Service Award upon graduation. She also attended summer intensives at Houston Ballet and BalletMet Columbus. She graduated from Duke as the University's first Dance major, with a double major in Developmental Psychology. While at Duke, she received the Louis Sudler Prize in the Arts for her choreography and performance work. Her choreography has been performed at various venues nationally, including the Piccolo Spoleto Festival in Charleston, SC.
