Weave It Wild Workshops! Introduction to Weaving on Looms of All Sizes... Rigid Heddle Backstrap (Ages 16 & up)

Rigid heddle looms have been used for centuries to introduce weaving concepts and loom operation. In each workshop, we will discuss appropriate weaving yarns and how to set up a loom.
