#### Durham Arts Council

The Major Provider of Arts Programs & Services for Artists and Arts Organizations, and the Public in Durham since 1954. DAC is the official Local Arts Agency for Durham and also serves a broad 5-county region.



- 1. DAC Serves the Public Providing yearround arts programs and arts experiences to over 400,000 people of all ages each year.
- 2. DAC Serves the Arts Sector Supports, showcases and employs arts organizations & artists. 2,000 artists, 300+ arts & cultural organizations served annually. DAC provided \$1.765 million to arts sector in FY20 through arts jobs, grants, facility space.
- 3. DAC Creates a Vibrant Community Creative Place–making & Public Art; Arts Advocacy, Arts–driven Economic Impact, and Cultural Planning.



#### Renovations for the Arts

Durham Arts Council led the renovation of the city owned DAC building to create Durham's Home for the Arts and has managed & programmed the building since 1978. DAC raised \$5.3 million in public, private funding.

## Facility Management Contract with City of Durham

Durham Arts Council has managed & programmed the building to create a Home for the Arts in Downtown Durham since 1978.

DAC is grateful for the strong support of the City of Durham and carefully stewards this important facility.

- DAC raised \$5.3 million to renovate building in 1988; City and County partnered in campaign.
- City sponsored major repairs, upgrades & HVAC replacement in FY2008 & FY2012. \$4.3 million
  - DAC Fully implemented City's new Facility Maintenance Plan FY2014
  - Advocating for and managing ongoing facility improvements

Annually expanding usage of the building to all sectors of community.



#### The DAC SCHOOL

DAC School provides life-long learning arts classes, workshops, lessons and camps each year to adults, veterans, special senior groups, teens, and children



In FY2020, DAC was on pace for a record year in Arts Education classes at DAC. Due to the Pandemic, DAC creatively pivoted to online program delivery in April 2020! DAC staff and teaching artists did an amazing job learning new technology and virtual teaching techniques.

Durham Arts Council provides more than \$20,000 in scholarships to children and teens each year.

#### Durham Arts Council Life-long Learning Arts Classes & Camps grew 67% since 2014. Covid pandemic hit FY20 DAC building closed to public since March 13

DAC offers classes in Visual Arts, Dance, Music, Theatre, Clay, Jewelry, Graphic Design, Digital Arts, Photography, Fiber Arts, Mindfulness, and more for children and adults of all ages and abilities.

## Durham Arts Council Provides Jobs and Financial Support to the Arts Sector

- DAC's direct investment in the arts sector has increased 29% over the past 10 years.
- In FY2020 DAC supported and assisted 1,858 artists\* and 377\* arts and cultural organizations through programs, services, grants, contract fees, teaching income, salaries, and art work sales.

• Since 1984, Durham Arts Council has given 1,713 grants to arts organizations and artists totaling:

\$5,217,208 in cash grants \$6,495,066 in facility grants

Over 50% of cash grants support arts organizations and artists of color reflecting Durham's diversity





 FY20 DAC awarded \$205,385 in cash grants and awarded \$383,369 in facility grants (up 7% vs FY19.)

### DAC's New "Durham Arts Catalyst" Grant Program Launched in FY2019.

The First Public Art Installation of the Durham SmART Program is Selected for National Recognition


Durham, NC - June 14, 2019—Americans for the Arts today honored "Durham in Continuum" - Durham SmART Corcoran Garage Art Banner Wrap which was selected and recognized as part of the Americans for the Arts 2019 Public Art Network (PAN) Year in Review. "Durham in Continuum" is among 50 outstanding public art projects created in 2018 in the United States and Canada that have been selected to be recognized through the Public Art Network Year in Review program, the only national program that specifically recognizes the most compelling public art. Chosen by public art experts, the roster of selected projects was unveiled this morning at Americans for the Arts' Annual Convention in Minneapolis. This is the 18th year that Americans for the Arts has recognized public art works.

## Durham Arts Council Annual Arts Fund

FY2020 DAC raised \$1,263,269 of its \$1,963,964 total cash revenue through contributions and grants and sponsorships from individuals, corporations, public sector, and foundations.

BY FY2023 Goal: Increase contributed cash support to \$1.5 million to further build arts & cultural sector sustainability through expanded DAC grant programs, additional arts employment and capacity building opportunities.
